**“Before, During, and After the War:” NGO-  
supported artistic narratives in Peru**

Art is an often-used transitional justice technique for helping individuals and groups affected by violence to work through and to recount their experiences of violence. This presentation analyses NGO-sponsored artwork in predominantly highland regions of Peru as a means to consider how developmental policies and transitional justice contexts may result in emplotment themes in depictions of scenes of life before, during and after the war. Such emplotment should be taken into consideration when analyzing these works for local memories of Peru’s internal armed conflict.
